## Operational Advice Notice Restricted Use of Charlie and Delta Taxiway Uncontrolled Crossings

## 1. Introduction

This instruction includes amendments to the original Operational Advice Notice published on the 26<sup>th</sup> March 2024.

Following a review of uncontrolled taxiway crossings, to reduce the likelihood of vehicle to vehicle and vehicle to aircraft conflict on the airside road network a number of these uncontrolled crossings will be closed.

Further enhancements will be made to the remaining crossings over the next 12 – 18 months.

From the **15**<sup>th</sup> **April 2024**, the use of the uncontrolled taxiway crossings on Taxiways Charlie and Delta will be **restricted** to the following vehicles only:

- Aircraft pushback tugs
- Elevators
- Televators
- Passenger Steps
- Tarmac Transporters

All other vehicle users must make their journeys around Terminal 5 via the airside road network. In advance of these restrictions, it is advisable that airside road users make themselves familiar with their alternative routes by using the airside road maps, which can be found on the Heathrow.com/airside website or <a href="here">here</a>.

































The current Airfield Maps, effective from October 2023, will be replaced once further uncontrolled crossing restrictions or closures have been implemented.
