Safety Alert Ramp Agent Fall from ULD Elevator

1. Introduction

The purpose of this safety alert is to remind operators of the safety considerations when working at height.

On the morning of 8th March a ramp agent was working on the elevated platform of a ULD elevator to unload ULDs from an inbound flight, when they fell approximately 2 metres to the ground and suffered injuries. They were conveyed to hospital by London Ambulance Service.

2. Safety Considerations

- Please continue to ensure your teams follow standard processes and safe systems of work when working at height, including:
 - Ensure only suitably trained and competent persons are working at height and that they understand the risks, hazard areas and know how to deploy protective measures including guard rails
 - Before commencing tasks, ensure any areas that pose a risk of falling are suitably protected using the guards and other safety measures on the equipment
 - Consider surface contaminants, including water and ensure that footwear is appropriate and in good condition
 - o Pro-activley manage any unsafe conditions
- Report close calls and unsafe acts via your company's reporting channels and through the Airport Community App.
