Safety Alert Tow Bar Feet

1. Introduction

Since January 2025, there have been four separate incidents where tow bar feet were found on the taxiway. These pose a serious Foreign Object Debris (FOD) risk, with one incident resulting in significant damage to an aircraft wheel.

This safety alert serves as a reminder to all ground handling teams of their responsibilities in preventing such occurrences.

2. Action Required

- Pushback teams must ensure the tow bar tap is fully closed before any manoeuvre begins. This is critical to prevent detachment during towing.
- Handlers are strongly encouraged to inspect all equipment, including tow bar feet, for signs of wear, erosion, or damage. Only serviceable equipment should be used.
- Airside Operations will conduct proactive monitoring to ensure compliance with equipment standards.
- Failure to meet these requirements may result in penalty points being issued due to the safety risks involved.
